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Lapbooks

Lapbooks can be a mom's best friend. Not only are they fun to make, but you create a fun and easy reference book to use for years ahead. Younger siblings can read these lapbooks too! Grandparents and other relatives will enjoy seeing these nifty collections of information, facts, and pictures.

Be sure to read information aloud for the auditory learner while the visual learner reads along. The kinesthetic learner will enjoy cutting and pasting to learn!

Before You Begin

Please read through the instructions carefully before you begin. Look at the pictures of the finished lapbook so that you know what you are making with your children.

Gather Your Materials

You don't need a lot of stuff to make a lapbook. It's simple! Just gather up the following materials.

2 or more File Folders (We like the brightly colored ones, but you can use the manila ones.)

Hot Glue Gun or Tacky Glue to Glue Folders Together

Glue Sticks to Paste booklets to the Folders

Scissors for Cutting Out Booklets

A Large Envelope to Store Lapbook

Colored Pencils

A Folder with Pockets to Store Things in Before they are Glued to the Lapbook

Make the Lapbook

Prepare the lapbook for decorating. Each lapbook will consist of file folders that are put together according to the individual lapbook instructions. You can use plain or colored file folders.

Keep in mind the space your student will have to work with. If he/she has a tiny work area, you might want to glue the folders together later on, but at least fold them where they need to be folded so that he/she knows where to paste booklets.

Read & Research

There is important information in each lapbook that is easy to understand and fun to read or listen to mom read aloud. Make sure that children understand the readings and ask questions about anything that is confusing.

Some lapbooks require research. In that case, library books make great sources. Please don't use websites only.

I would recommend books for research with websites to supplement. Living books that are interesting and easy to understand are a great choice. My children love books with lots of pictures!

There is space in the lapbook to take notes from research materials, but you can use a notebook to record data too.

Cut and Paste the Lapbook

Have your children cut out the little booklets and fill them in with their neatest handwriting. Color pictures neatly with colored pencils instead of crayons—they make it easier to stay in the lines.

Remind your children to cut with their thumb up. Turn the paper, not the scissors, when you cut around corners. Mom might need to do some cutting if the shape is too difficult.

Glue sticks are great for pasting booklets onto the lapbook. Elmer's or white glue tends to be too wet.

Decorate the Lapbook

Be creative as you decorate your booklets and the lapbook itself. You might want to add stickers, ribbons, or drawings.

Require your child to be neat and careful as they write, draw, color, and paste. Something that is neat and beautiful will be a memory that will be enjoyed by your children in the future and, just maybe, their children too.

Children will enjoy showing off their work if it is neat and artistic too.

We hope you will enjoy creating this lapbook with your children!

How to Use This Book

This book was created for homeschooling families to use to teach Bible. Each week, there is a Scripture, a booklet, a hands-on fun activity, Scriptures to memorize, and handwriting pages.

We have included Scriptures to memorize for younger children, with a set of Scripture Memory Cards and matching handwriting pages, as well as a set for older children as well. For children who are especially gifted at memorization you might what to have them memorize both sets. You can be copy the back of a handwriting page if you need additional pages for handwriting practice.


We recommend:


- Day I of Each Week: Read Scripture, say memory verse together, and enjoy the week's lesson.
- Day 2 of Each Week: Say memory verses together, review lesson, and decorate an age appropriate handwriting page.
- Day 3 of Each Week: Say memory verses together, review lesson, create booklet, and paste it in the lapbook.
- Day 4 of Each Week: Say memory verses together, review lesson, and have students copy the scripture verse on their decorated handwriting page.
- Day 5 of Each Week: Say memory verses together, review lesson, and do Hands-On-Fun activity.

How to Assemble This Lapbook

In these pages you will find all the cutouts you need to make a creation week lapbook.


To make these lapbooks you will need a printed color copy of this book and two matching file folders per lapbook.





Open each file folder then refold it so that the sides almost meet in the center, just to the left and right of the original fold.


Position the two folders so that the cutouts on the edges of the fold line up. Using Tacky Glue®, a hot glue gun, or similar glue, connect the two folders at the inside matching flaps. This will leave you with two large panels each with an inside left and right flap and outside flaps.



Once the folders are prepared have students color in the Creation Week Title Plate, and the Name Plate. It is much easier to color first before cutting out the shapes. Cut out Creation Week Images as desired and paste them on the front of the folder to decorate it.

Once the front is decorated appropriately, follow the instructions throughout this book and, using a glue stick, paste all your booklets into your Creation Week lapbook.


To close the lapbook, simply fold in the outside flaps toward the center. Fold the center flap to the right and then fold the left panel over the right. This will display the front of the lapbook where the Title Plate and Name Plate are proudly displayed.



Remember to color pages before cutting them out. This makes it so


much easier to color all the

We used a ruler to help fold some of the booklets.








When you have finished putting together the entire lapbook you will have a lovely keepsake which can be used to talk about creation week year after year.




You can tuck the handwriting page into the lapbook.

On Day One, God made light. He called the light "day" and the dark "night".





Activity: Color cover and fill out your Day One Booklet. Cut out all three pieces. To assemble, Cut out the white rectangle on the right side of the inside of the booklet. Slide the tab on the triangle through the slot in the booklet. Tape the tab to the back of the booklet. Glue the back of the booklet into the lapbook.



On the lines inside the booklet, write what God did on the first day of creation. For example, "On Day One, God created light." or "Let there be light"






Hands-On Fun with a Prism

Today we will use a prism to break up light into the colors that blend together to make light. Prisms are often made of glass, plastic, and fluorite. When you hold up your prism to the light so that light can pass through, it will disperse, or separate, light into red, orange, yellow, green, blue, and purple. You see, all those colors fit together to make white light that we see. Isn't that amazing? Light is made of waves. Each color of light has a different wavelength. The prism bends the lights and changes the lengths of the waves so that lights with different wavelengths leave the prism at different angels.

Sometimes, rain droplets in the atmosphere can act like a prism and make a rainbow in the sky. Have you ever seen a rainbow after the rain stops?

Use a prism to disperse or scatter the light so that you can see little rainbows.

Another fun thing to do is to use crystals from a chandelier. Or just watch the sun light stream through the little crystals on the chandelier and see all the little rainbows on the wall.




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

Week Three/Creation Day Two: God Made the Sky

Genesis 1:6-8



God made the expanse, and separated the waters which were below the expanse from the waters which were above the expanse; and it was so. God called the expanse heaven. And there was evening and there was morning, a second day.

Activity: Color in and fill out your Day Two Booklet. Cut out the water image, color it darker blue then paste it on the bottom of the right side of the inside of the booklet. Color the sky above the water lighter blue then cut the booklet out and glue it to the lapbook.



On the lines inside the booklet, write what God did on the second day of creation. For example, "On Day Two, God created the waters and the sky."

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Hands-on Fun: Waters Separated

It seems like there was water everywhere and God decided to separate it. He separated the waters below from the water above.



Where is the water "below"?

Where is the water "above"?

The water below is the ocean and the water above is in the clouds. Wait what? It's in the clouds? Yes!

The water in clouds is in a gas form as water vapor.


You see, water comes in three forms: Liquid (like the water you drink), solid (like ice cubes), and gas (like steam from a pot when somethings boiling).

Hands-on Fun: Liquid-Solid-Gas

Water is made up of molecules. Each water molecule is made up of 2 hydrogen atoms and I oxygen atom. This is important to know because how these molecules are packed determines whether water is a liquid or a solid or a gas.

In a solid, molecules are packed tightly together and stay together. Ice does not change shape or volume.

In a liquid, molecules are less tightly packed so that they can move around and take the shape of it's container. Water can fit in a tall thin glass or short wide one. Water loses its shape, but keeps its volume.

In a gas, the molecules spread way out and take the shape and volume of its container.

Hands-On Fun: Why Do Ice Cubes Float?

Pour water into a glass until it is half full. Add 5 ice cubes. What do you notice about the ice cubes?

Most substances are heavier when they are a solid than a liquid, but water is different. God made water to be unique and special so that fish can keep swimming in the oceans in the coldest of winters.

Try this experiment from KidsAnswers and discover for yourself why ice floats and why water is so special.


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

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Week Four/Creation Day Three: God Made the Land & Plants



On Day Three, God gathered the waters in one place and created land. He called the waters seas. He also created all kinds of plants.


Genesis 1:9-12

Then God said, "Let the waters below the heavens be gathered into one place, and let the dry land appear"; and it was so. God called the dry land earth, and the gathering of the waters He called seas; and God saw that it was good. Then God said, "Let the earth sprout vegetation, plants yielding seed, and fruit trees on the earth bearing fruit after their kind with seed in them"; and it was so. The earth brought forth vegetation, plants yielding seed after their kind, and trees bearing

fruit with seed in them, after their kind; and God saw that it was good. There was evening and there was morning, a third day.

Activity: Color the front cover of Panel I. Cut out Panels I, 2, & 3. Spread glue across the entire tab labeled Glue Here and stick the next panel onto that tab. Color and cut out the Water Image then glue it to the back of the strip you created, lined up to the left edge. Color and cut out the two Land Images. Glue Land Image 2 to the right side of the strip and Land Image I lined up on the left edge, overlapping the Water Image. Color and cut out the plants and glue them on the land. Glue the booklet to the lapbook with the square marked Glue Here down. Fold the strip back and forth on the fold lines. See the "Example" on page page 45.


Hands-On Fun: Plant a Seed

Directions:

Color the sun below yellow, the continents on the earth picture below green, and the oceans on the same picture blue. Cut out the moon, the earth, and the sun pictures. Cut the string into a piece 18" long and a piece 9" long. Press a brad from front to back through the center of each picture. There is a circle to mark the spot. Tightly tie one end of each string onto the back of the brad through the earth. Bend the prongs of the brad loosely enough so that the strings can rotate around without slipping off. Tie the other end of the long string tightly onto the back of the brad through the sun and the short string onto the back of the brad through the moon. Bend the prongs of the brads loosely enough so that the strings can rotate around without slipping off. Turn all the pictures face up. You now can make the moon orbit earth and the earth orbit the sun. See the example on the next page.



Activity: Color the front cover of Panel I. Cut out Panels I, 2, & 3. Spread glue across the entire tab labeled Glue Here and stick the next panel onto that tab. Color and cut out the first Water Image then glue it to the back of the strip you created, lined up to the left edge. Color and cut out the second Water Images then glue it next to the first Water Image. Color and cut out the sea creatures and birds then glue them in the air and sea. Glue the booklet to the lapbook with the square marked Glue Here down. Fold the strip back and forth on the fold lines.



Hands-On Fun: Bird Watching

You will need binoculars for this activity and comfortable clothing. Be sure to bring water with you.


First walk around your neighborhood and notice all the birds that live there. You might want to visit a park if you think there will be more birds there.

Next it's time to use your binoculars to see the birds up close. I like to take along a Bird Guide so I can try to figure out which bird I am looking at.


I also like to take photographs of birds when I go bird-watching.

Fold the strip back and forth on the fold lines.








Real Men Discipleship Manuals
