How to Use this Book

Christmas is a wonderful time to do family devotions. It's not locking you into a year-long commitment. In fact, there are only 18 days of devotions. I wrote these books when Katie Beth was a little girl—she's my oldest child. By 1991, I typed them up on an electric typewriter and made copies stapled on the side. As the years have gone by, they look a bit nicer, but the content remains the same—the timeless Christmas story for all ages!

We always started this Christmas devotions on December 16 because we did other devotions for the first half of the month. As the years went by and the children hit teenage and young adulthood, we started earlier because we were not able to gather every day due to jobs, classes, and other commitments. In other words, you can start whenever you want.

Scripture

The Christmas story, starting with Elizabeth and Zechariah, never grows old. I love the baby miracles, the humility of the people involved in the drama, and the way God fulfills the prophetic words of Scripture to Anna and Simeon. The story of the angels singing as the King of Kings arrives in Bethlehem is one of my very favorite things to celebrate.

Our family devotions were created to make Christmas more meaningful for parents, children, grandparents, and friends. It puts the focus on the story of Jesus who came to give His life as a ransom for many.

Our family devotions were written back in 1991 so as you can imagine, there were less options for Bible translation. This is a vintage version of the NIV Bible translation—more accurate than today's version.

The Scripture passage is right here in the book. You don't have to look anything up. However, you can read the same passage out of any Bible translation. We heartily recommend NASB, NKJV, and ESV.

Just read the passage and answer the questions aloud. There are also questions for younger children. When the children were preschool and younger elementary age, we did a lot of acting out of Bible stories. You can also add puppets and games if you want to.

Worship

Singing is such a fun part of Christmas! There are Christmas songs to worship to and just plain old fun songs to sing. We always did both. Our family loves to sing. There are options for each day, but you can sing whatever you want to sing. There are so many choices right in this book and many others beyond this book.

The second section of the book contains lyrics to 43 Christmas carols and songs. There are so many more contemporary ones I'd love to add, but can't due to copyright issues. However, feel free to substitute.

Hands-On Fun

These activities are mostly simple (some are a little bit more complicated) with the idea of driving the point home. For example, when the read the passage of Mary and Joseph going to Bethlehem due to the census, the family takes a census in their home of books, clothing, or movies. It gets the point across.

December 16: Zechariah



"In the time of Herod king of Judea there was a priest named Zechariah, who belonged to the priestly division of Abijah; his wife Elizabeth was also a descendant of Aaron. Both of them were upright in the sight of God, observing all the Lord's commandments and regulations blamelessly. But they had no children, because Elizabeth was barren; and they were both well along in years.

Once when Zechariah's division was on duty and he was serving as priest before God, he was chosen by lot, according to the custom of the priesthood, to go into the temple of the Lord and burn incense. And when the time for the burning of incense came, all the assembled worshippers were praying outside.

Then an angel of the Lord appeared to him, standing at the right side of the altar of incense. When Zechariah saw him, he was startled and was gripped with fear. But the angel said to him: 'Do not be afraid, Zechariah; your prayer has been heard.

Your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you are to give him the name John. He will be a joy and delight to you, and many will rejoice because of his birth, for he will be great in the sight of the Lord. He is never to take wine or other fermented drink, and he will be filled with the Holy Spirit even from birth. Many of the people of Israel will he bring back to the Lord their God. And he will go on before the Lord, in the spirit and power of Elijah, to turn the hearts of the fathers to their children and the disobedient to the wisdom of the righteous--to make ready a people prepared for the Lord.'

Zechariah asked the angel 'How can I be sure of this? I am an old man and my wife is well along in years.'

The angel answered, 'I am Gabriel. I stand in the presence of God, and I have been sent to speak to you and to tell you this good news. And now you will be silent and not able to speak until the day this happens, because you did not believe my words, which will come true at their proper time.'

Meanwhile, the people were waiting for Zechariah and wondering why he stayed so long in the temple. When he came out, he could not speak to them. They realized he had seen a vision in the temple, for he kept making signs to them but remained unable to speak.

When his time of service was completed, he returned home. After this his wife Elizabeth became pregnant and for five months remained in seclusion. 'The Lord has done this form me,' she said, 'In these days he has shown his favor and taken away my disgrace among the people.'," (Luke 1:5-25 NIV © 1979).

- What could John the Baptist be entrusted to Elizabeth and Zechariah?
- What great things would John do for God?
- What disgrace would you like the Lord to remove from your life?

December 17: Gabriel



"In the sixth month, God sent the angel Gabriel to Nazareth, a town in Galilee, to a virgin pledged to be married to a man named Joseph, a descendant of David. The virgin's name was Mary. The angel went to her and said, `Greetings, you who are highly favored! The Lord is with you.'

Mary was greatly troubled at his words and wondered what kind of greeting this might be. But the angel said to her. Do not be afraid, Mary, you have found favor with God. You will be with child and give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his father David, and he will reign over the house of Jacob forever; his kingdom will never end.'

`How will this be,' Mary asked the angel, `since I am a virgin?'

The angel answered, `The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. So, the holy one to be born will be called the Son of God. Even Elizabeth your relative is going to have a child in her old age, and she who was said to be barren is in her sixth month. For nothing is impossible with God.'

`I am the Lord's servant,' Mary answered. `May it be to me as you have said.' Then the angel left her," (Luke 1:26-38 NIV © 1979)

- What difficult circumstances might lie ahead for Mary?
- Describe Mary's heart toward God and His will?
- What does it mean for us today that "nothing is impossible with God"?

December 18: Mary & Elizabeth



"At that time Mary got ready and hurried to a town in the hill country of Judah, where she entered Zechariah's home and greeted Elizabeth. When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the baby leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit. In a loud voice she exclaimed: `Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the child you will bear! But why am I so favored, that the mother of my Lord should come to me? As soon as the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the baby in my womb leaped for joy. Blessed is she who has believed that what the Lord has said to her will be accomplished!'" (Luke 1:39-45 NIV © 1979).

DISCUSSION

- Why would Mary go visit Elizabeth?
- How would Mary be a blessing to Elizabeth? (Note: Elizabeth was in her sixth month when Gabriel appears, Mary travels and stays about 3 months.)
- How would Elizabeth be a help to Mary? (See Titus 2:3-5)
- Inside Elizabeth's womb, John is already filled with the Holy Spirit. Why does He leap when he hears the sound of Mary's greeting?
- Elizabeth is then filled with the Holy Spirit and prophesies. What does the prophetic word mean?
- Why does Elizabeth call Mary, "the mother of my Lord"?
- What can we see about the role of the Holy Spirit in relationship to Jesus?
- How can we be more filled with the Holy Spirit?

He has filled the hungry with good things but has sent the rich away empty.

He has helped his servant Israel, remembering to be merciful to Abraham and his descendants forever, even as he said to our fathers.'

Mary stayed with Elizabeth for about three months and then returned home," (Luke 1:46-56 NIV © 1979).

December 20: John is Born



"When it was time for Elizabeth to have her baby, she gave birth to a son. Her neighbors and relatives heard that the Lord had shown her great mercy, and they shared her joy.

On the eighth day they came to circumcise the child, and they were going to name him after his father Zechariah, but his mother spoke up and said, 'No! He is to be called John.'

They said to her, 'There is no one among your relatives who has that name.'

Then they made signs to his father, to find out what he would like to name the child. He asked for a writing tablet, and to everyone's astonishment he wrote, 'His name is John.' Immediately his mouth was opened and his tongue was loosed, and he began to speak, praising God. The neighbors were all filled with awe, and throughout the hill country of Judea people were talking about all these things. Everyone who heard this wondered about it, asking, 'What then is this child going to be?' For the Lord's hand was with him," (Luke 1:57-66 NIV © 1979).

He has raised up a horn of salvation for us in the house of his servant David (as he said through his holy prophets of long ago),
salvation from our enemies and from the hand of all who hate us--
to show mercy to our fathers and to remember his holy covenant, the oath he swore to our father Abraham:
to rescue us from the hand of our enemies, and to enable us to serve him without fear in holiness and righteousness before him all our days.

And you, my child, will be called a prophet of the Most High; for you will go on before the Lord to prepare the way for him,
to give his people the knowledge of salvation through the forgiveness of their sins,
because of the tender mercy of our God, by which the rising sun will come to us from heaven to shine on those living in darkness and in the shadow of death,
to guide our feet into the path of peace.'

And the child grew and became strong in spirit; and he lived in the desert until he appeared publicly to Israel" (Luke 1:67-80 NIV © 1979).

DISCUSSION

- Zechariah was filled with the Holy Spirit and prophesied over his son. What will John's role be in the nation of Israel?
- How can John prepare for his future ministry?
- How can you prepare for your future ministry?

December 22: Joseph

"This is how the birth of Jesus Christ came about. His mother Mary was pledged to be married to Joseph, but before they came together, she was found to be with child through the Holy Spirit. Because Joseph her husband was a righteous man and did not want to expose her to public disgrace, he had in mind to divorce her quietly.

But after he had considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, 'Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins.'

All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: 'The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel'—which means, 'God with us.'

When Joseph woke up, he did what the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took Mary home to be his wife. But he had no union with her until she gave birth to a son. And he gave him the name Jesus," (Matthew 1:18-25 NIV © 1979).

December 23: The Census



"In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world. (This was the first census that took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria.) And everyone went to his own town to register.

So, Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David. He went there to register with Mary, who was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in strips of cloth and placed him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn," (Luke 2:1-7 NIV © 1979).

- How did the Lord use all these things to fulfill His prophetic words and grand purposes?

December 24: The Word



"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was with God in the beginning.

Through Him all things were made: without Him nothing was made that has been made. In Him was life, and that life was the light of men. The light shines in the darkness, but the darkness has not understood it.

There came a man who was sent from God; his name was John. He came as a witness to testify concerning that light, so that through him all men might believe. He himself was not the light; he came only as a witness to the light. The true light that gives light to every man was coming into the world.

He was in the world, and though the world was made through Him, the world did not recognize him. He came to that which was his own, but His own did not receive him. Yet to all who received Him, to those who believed in His name, He gave the right to become children of God—children born not of natural descent, nor of human decision or a husband's will, but born of God.

The Word became flesh and lived for awhile among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the One and Only Son, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth.

John testifies concerning him. He cries out, saying, "This was he of whom I said, "He who comes after me has surpassed me because he was before me."

From the fullness of his grace, we have all received one blessing after another. For the law was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. No one has ever seen God, but God the only Son, who is at the Father's side, has made him known," (John 1:1-18 NIV © 1979).
