Rachel Field Books

Rachel like hearing books read aloud so she didn't learn to read until she was 10. She had a photographic memory, too. The heroine of her most famous book, Hitty is a real doll and inspired the story. Rachel grew up in Massachusetts and began writing at an early age. She married Arthur Pederson in 1935 and they had one daughter. Unfortunately, this talented writer died young (47) of pneumonia after an operation.

Johanna Spyri Books

Johanna Louise Heusser grew up in the countryside of Zurich, Switzerland. She married a lawyer, Bernhard Spyri and began writing prolifically mostly children's books set in the Swiss Alps and countryside. Written in German, several of her works are translated into English.

Mary Mapes Dodge Books

Mary Elizabeth Mapes was classically educated at home. She not only showed talent at a young age for writing but drawing and music as well. She married Willaim Dodge in 1851, had two children, and was widowed in 1858. She returned to her parents' home and took up writing. Soon she was involved in magazine writing and publishing including becoming the editor of *Hearth and Home* and publisher/editor of *St. Nicholas* magazine for children. In later years, she wrote short stories and books. Her most popular and famous work is *Hans Brinker*.

Born in Connecticut, Eleanor grew up in a home that loved books. Her father was a bookkeeper for a railway and her mother a seamstress who told her children lots of made-up stories. Eleanor became a children's librarian and married fellow librarian Rice Estes. When she was confined to bed with tuberculosis, she began writing. My favorite characters, the Moffats, lived in Cranbury, Connecticut loosely based on her own hometown of west Haven.


